Eni sent us the following response:

"Eni does not comment on legal matters.

With regards to climate change, Eni acknowledges the challenge posed by climate change and the need to limit this century the temperature increase to 2°C above the level of the pre-industrial era. However demand for energy will continue to grow in the coming decades, driven by demographic and economic growth in emerging economies. Renewable energy, while having an increasingly important role in the energy supply, can not, in the medium term, replace hydrocarbons and natural gas, in particular, will continue to meet a key part of global energy demand, even in lower carbon intensity scenarios.
