 The Superior Court erred by misconstruing Counts I through IV of Appellants' Complaint for Declaratory and Equitable Relief as

presenting a single constitutional claim to an unenumerated substantive due process right to a stable climate system, dismissing the case in full without addressing the other claims presented in Counts I through IV alleging violations of previously recognized constitutional rights.

- 2. The Superior Court erred by failing to liberally construe and assume the truth of the facts alleged in Appellants' amended complaint regarding the State's energy policy and how the State's affirmative systemic actions implementing that policy exacerbate climate change in violation of Appellants' constitutional rights.
- 3. The Superior Court erred by determining the constitutional claims raised in Appellants' amended complaint were nonjusticiable under the political question doctrine where Plaintiffs challenge the State's energy policy, reflected in AS 44.99.115(2)(B), and its affirmative systemic conduct in implementing that policy, as violative of Appellants' constitutional rights.
- 4. The Superior Court erred by determining that reductions in Alaska's greenhouse gas emissions would not redress Appellants' injuries, contrary to this Court's conclusions in *Kanuk v. State, Department of Natural Resources*, 335 P.3d 1088, 1092-95 (Alaska 2014), that the plaintiffs therein, including one of the Appellants here, had injury-

interest standing based on similar harms arising from climate change.

5. The Superior Court erred by determining that Appellants Alaska

violated Appellants' constitutional rights.
