Dear Mr. Langer,

This responds to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's letter dated April 11, 2019. There, the Commission sought to correct a purported "misstatement" by Commission Solicitor Robert Solomon during oral argument in *Birckhead v. FERC* concerning the Commission's position on whether jurisdictional limits imposed by the Natural Gas Act break the causal chain necessary to trigger NEPA review of upstream and downstream emissions that this Court has held are indirect effects of the Commission's grant of a gas certificate in *Sierra Club v. FERC*, 867 F.3d 1357 (D.C. Cir. 2017).

This Court must reject the Commission's letter as an improper, post-argument submission. Rule 28(j) affords the sole avenue for supplementing the record after a case has been submitted for oral argument and is intended for the limited purpose of citing to newly issued cases and not as here, to enable parties to change their position or reinforce arguments when the opposing parties lack a chance to rebut. Because the Commission's ruling may prejudice the petitioners who lack an opportunity to respond, this Court should reject the Commission's unauthorized submission and rely solely on the record, the parties' briefs and the oral argument transcript in rendering a decision. If this Court intends to consider the substance of the letter, we respectfully request an opportunity to respond on the merits.
