**REQUEST FOR JUDICIAL NOTICE IN SUPPORT OF MARATHON OIL CORPORATION'S AND MARATHON OIL COMPANY'S SUPPLEMENTAL MOTION TO DISMISS THE COMPLAINT FOR LACK OF PERSONAL JURISDICTION**

Defendants Marathon Oil Corporation ("MRO") and Marathon Oil Company ("MOC") (collectively "Marathon Oil") by their undersigned attorneys, pursuant to Rule 201(d) of the Rhode Island Rules of Evidence, hereby request that the Court, in consideration of their Supplemental Motion to Dismiss the Complaint for Lack of Personal Jurisdiction filed concurrently herewith (the "Motion") and accompanying memorandum ("Memorandum"), take judicial notice of certain exhibits cited in the Memorandum. True and correct copies of these documents are attached hereto as Exhibits A through D:

### ARGUMENT

These documents are properly considered in connection with the Motion and Memorandum because they are public records or official reports and SEC filings where the contents of these exhibits are “capable of accurate and ready determination by resort to sources whose accuracy cannot reasonably be questioned.” R.I. R. Evid. 201(b)(2).

“Judicial notice may be taken at any stage of the proceeding.” *Id.* at 201(d). At the motion to dismiss stage, a court may properly look to “any facts and laws of which the trial court could properly take judicial notice.” *Casperson v AAA Southern New England*, No. PC 2014-6139, 2015 WL 9582091, at \*5 (R.I. Super. Dec. 22, 2015) (*quoting Berberian v. New England Tel. & Tel. Co.*, 330 A.2d 813, 815 (R.I. 1975)).

Public records, official reports of administrative agencies, and other publicly available documents whose accuracy cannot be reasonably questioned are proper subjects for judicial notice. *See Hamilton v. Ballard*, 161 A.3d 470, 475 n.10 (R.I. 2017) (concluding that Rhode Island courts “may take judicial notice of public records, including deeds”); *State Terminal Corp. v. Gen. Scrap Iron, Inc.*, 264 A.2d 334, 337 (R.I. 1970) (taking judicial notice of public records in the form of legislative journals for sessions of the General Assembly); *see also Massachusetts v. Westcott*, 431 U.S. 322, 322 n.2 (1977) (public records of administrative agencies may be judicially noticed); *Ms. S. v. Regional Sch. Unit 72*, 829 F.3d 95, 103 n.4 (1st

Cir. 2016) (taking judicial notice of public record materials relating to Maine Department of Education’s rulemaking process).<sup>1</sup>

The records for which Marathon Oil seeks judicial notice are public records or official reports and SEC filings. Specifically:

- Exhibit A is excerpts of MRO’s Form 10-K, filed with the SEC on February 21, 2019.
- Exhibits B through D are population information provided by the United States Census Bureau and the World Health Organization.

Because these exhibits are documents whose authenticity is not subject to reasonable dispute and the contents of which “can be accurately and readily determined from sources whose accuracy cannot reasonably be questioned” (R.I. R. Evid. 201(b)(2)), each is the proper subject of judicial notice.

### CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, Defendants request that the Court take judicial notice of the data contained in Exhibits A through D, attached hereto, in connection with its consideration of the Motion.

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<sup>1</sup> Because the Rhode Island Rules of Evidence “are based upon the federal rules,” Rhode Island courts routinely look to federal decisions interpreting analogous federal rules for persuasive authority. *See, e.g., State v. Damiano*, 587 A.2d 396, 400–01 (R.I. 1991); *State v. Bunnell*, 47 A.3d 220, 231 & n.15 (R.I. 2012).

#### General

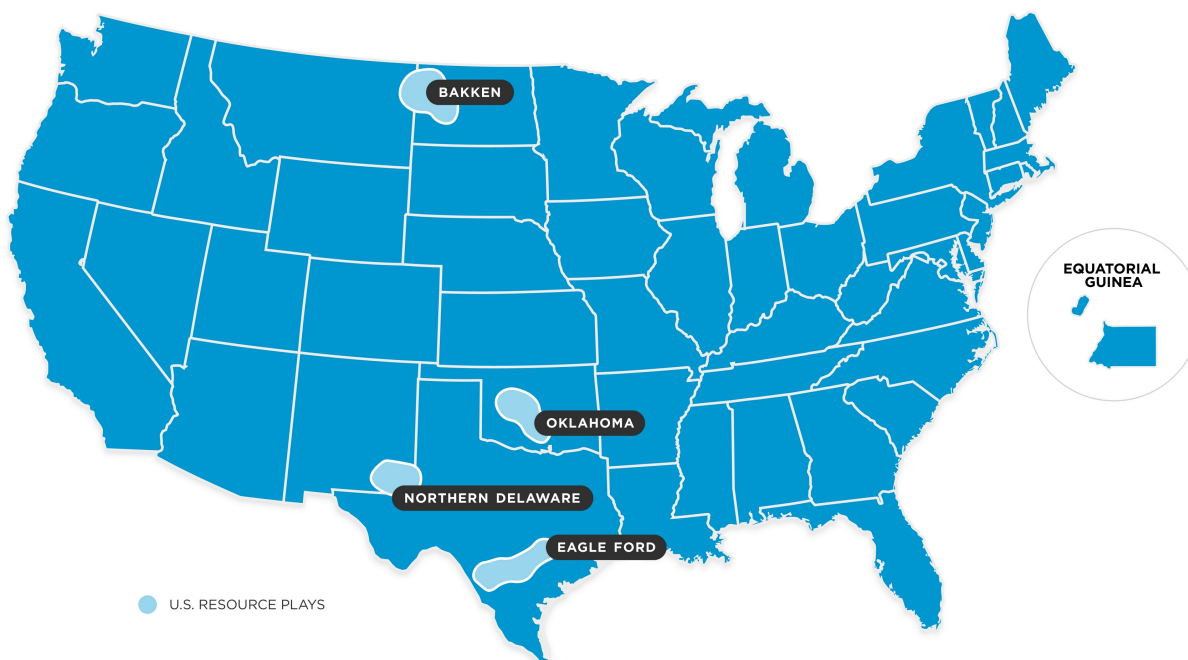
Marathon Oil Corporation (NYSE: MRO) is an independent exploration and production company based in Houston, Texas, focused on U.S. resource plays with operations in the United States, Europe and Africa. Our corporate headquarters is located at 5555 San Felipe Street, Houston, Texas 77056-2723 and our telephone number is (713) 629-6600. Each of our two reportable operating segments are organized by geographic location and managed according to the nature of the products and services offered. The two segments are:

- United States – explores for, produces and markets crude oil and condensate, NGLs and natural gas in the United States;
- International – explores for, produces and markets crude oil and condensate, NGLs and natural gas outside of the United States and produces and markets products manufactured from natural gas, such as LNG and methanol, in E.G.

We were incorporated in 2001. On July 1, 2011 we became an Independent E&P after we completed the spin-off of our refining, marketing and transportation business, creating two independent energy companies: Marathon Oil and MPC.

Our strategy is to deliver competitive and improving corporate level returns by focusing our capital investment in the lower cost, higher margin U.S. resource plays while maintaining a peer-leading balance sheet, prioritizing sustainable cash flow generation at conservative oil prices, and returning capital to shareholders.
